The Great Prayer of Thanksgiving

Pastor The Lord be with you.

People: And also with you.

Pastor: Lift up your hearts.

People: We lift them to the Lord.

Pastor: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Men: Why do we give thanks at this table?

People: We give thanks for God's creation, for making us in God's image. We give thanks because God never gave up on us even though we were not faithful to God. We give thanks because when it was time, God sent the only Son, Jesus, to show God's love for us.

Women: How do we praise God for all this?

Pastor: With all the faithful of every time and place, this song is sung to God's glory:

People: Holy, Holy, Holy Lord, God of power and might. Heaven and earth are full of your glory, Hosanna in the highest! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest! Hosanna in the highest!

Pastor: What do we remember at this table?

People: We remember God's Son, Jesus: He healed the sick and restored sight to the blind; He welcomed strangers and ate with outcasts. Dying on the cross, he saved us from our sins, Risen from the dead, he gives us new life.

People: WE remember God's Son, Jesus: He healed the sick and restored sight to the blind; He welcomed strangers and ate with outcasts. Dying on the cross, he saved us from our sins, Risen from the dead, he gives us new life.

Pastor: How are we able to remember?

People: We are able to remember because of the gift of the Holy Spirit. God's first gift to those who believe, who will complete God's work in the world.

Men: Why do we eat at this table?

Pastor: On the night before he died, Jesus took bread, blessed it, and gave it to his friends. He told them to eat it and remember him. And ministering in Jesus' name we do likewise.

Women: Why do we drink from the cup at this table?

Pastor: After the meal, Jesus took the cup, and gave it to them as the promise that our sins are forgiven. And ministering in Jesus name, we do likewise.

People: But this is just everyday bread and grape juice.

Pastor: Let us pray that the everyday bread and juice will become holy: Gracious God, pour out your Holy Spirit upon us and upon these your gifts of bread and cup, that the bread we break and the cup we bless may be the communion of the body and blood of Christ.

People: Through Christ, with Christ, in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor are yours, Almighty God, now and forever.
