October 6<sup>th</sup>, congregations around the globe will celebrate World Communion Sunday. Each year I have mentioned the importance of World communion Sunday, but you may

not know much about where the concept originated. According to the website of the National Council of Church, World Communion Sunday began in 1936 in the Presbyterian Church and was adopted by the Federal Council of Church in 1940. Since then, this celebration has grown as an international ecumenical celebration of Christian unity.

The key word for World Communion Sunday is communion, or unity. This is the day we acknowledge the nearly universal Christian practice of breaking bread with one another and remembering both the night of Jesus' betrayal and Jesus' sacrifice. While communion is a large part of this story, there are also flavors of Pentecost to this as well. A time when people from around the Mediterranean world came together in mutual understanding and inspiration, by the power of the Holy Spirit. World Communion gives us a chance to remember that around the globe, in many different languages, with a wide variety of traditions and customs, and various forms of liturgy – the Lord's Supper is celebrated. At its best, World Communion Sunday serves multiple purposes: both a joyous and meaningful partaking in Jesus' sacred meal with his friends and a mind-opening explore to different Christian traditions from around the world.

We know we lost a lot of blankets, backpacks, school supplies and toys. We should have a better idea what items we need most by November as we move items around, and get organized. Backpacks and school supplies will be on clearance, and all school aged children receive new school supplies at the Christmas Store. We always need toys for all ages at the Christmas Store, if you can help out we would appreciate it!


